

FIRST ARTHROSCOPIC SURGERY PERFORMED IN GMC BARAMULLA

First arthroscopic procedure of knee was performed by the department of Orthopaedics successfully of a female patient in presence of worthy Principal Dr. (Prof) Ruby Reshi, the patient was diagnosed with tear of meniscus.

"This facility will help people of North Kashmir, Now they don't need to go to Srinagar or outside state for arthroscopic procedures of knee", said Principal GMC Baramulla Dr (Prof) Ruby Reshi.

"Her presence at the time of our first knee Arthroscopic procedure was encouragement for whole orthopaedic surgical team", Dr Ishtiyaq Abdullah (Asst. Professor Orthopaedics) added.

The procedure was done by Dr Ishtiyaq Abdullah (Assistant Professor), Dr. Zamir Ali (Asst Professor), Mr Jaffar, Mr Fareed, Mr. Javid, Mr Mufeed and others. "We are very thankful to our Principal Dr (Prof) Ruby Reshi for her efforts to bring this institute in limelight', said in charge OT Mohammad Hussain Geelani.



DIALYSIS CENTER IN GMC BARAMULLA - A BOON FOR PATIENTS IN THE NORTH

Since its inception in 2018, the Dialysis Center in GMC Baramulla has conducted 15,306 dialysis sessions.

The Jammu and Kashmir government has been operating three such centres in the valley. One each at Anantnag District Hospital in South Kashmir, GMC Baramulla in North Kashmir, and the third one at Rainawari in Srinagar.

The North Center has been sanctioned under the Pradhan Mantri National Dialysis (PMND) program and has brought relief to the patients who live in far-off areas of North Kashmir.

The dialysis centre sees a steady influx of people each day. Speaking to the media cell GMC, in charge of the dialysis center Mr Umer said "We do 340 sessions monthly and have done 15,306 sessions till now". The centre has specific machines designed for HCV+ patients to keep all other patients safe from getting infected.

For patients that fall below the poverty line, the centre has made the facility free of charge, while others have to pay less than 1000 for a single sitting.

"I used to spend more than 10000 every week, but now I feel relaxed. I had to go to Srinagar every week this centre has made it easier for me, even though I live in Uri but it still makes a lot of difference" said a patient who has been attending dialysis sessions since 2019.


The Department of Community Medicine GMC Baramulla through Rural Training Health Centre Kalantra conducted a Mega Health Camp in the remote area of Shiripora Baramulla.

Following Health Care Services were delivered under the supervision of Dr. Uruj, Assistant Professor Community Medicine:

- 1. Free Medical Checkup of 97 Patients.
- 2. On spot NCD Screening of 73 patients.
- 3. Distribution of free medicines viz., Albendzol, Vit C and D, Calcium, Metformim, Telmisartan, Amlodipine, ORS, Zinc tablets, IFA tablet and Multi Vitamin, PCM and other essential drugs.
- 4. Moreover, extensive community awareness lectures on Hypertension, Diabetes and CVD diseases, their causes and prevention were held to make the citizens well informed.

The team braved the harsh winter conditions and travelled by foot to reach the area of Shiripora Baramulla which included: Dr, Salman Rafiq, Dr Basaina Gulzar, Dr Shazia, Dr Saadat, Dr Muzamil, Dr Ayman, Dr Fiza, Dr Sadaf, Ab Qayoom, Irfan Hussain and Ab Aziz and Media & Creative Cell Officials.

As per the recent estimates, the population of this subcentre is 2444 with very little medical help at their disposal. The sub center Shirpora is located 25 km from GMC Baramulla.





FIRST CHEST WALL RECONSTRUCTION SURGERY PERFORMED IN THE INSTITUTION

In a first for the institution, GMC Baramulla conducted a chest wall reconstruction surgery. A 25-year-old female with pectus carinatum was operated on with excision of 8,9,10 ribs. The chest wall reconstruction surgery was headed by Dr Mir Mushtaq and Dr Fozia. Dr Fayaz assisted with the surgery as the anaesthetist.

The patient is recovering well and is looking cosmetically better too. The surgery is the first chest wall reconstruction surgery done at GMC Baramulla.

GMC BARAMULLA OBSERVES WORLD CANCER DAY. SEES HEALTHY PARTICIPATION FROM THE MASSES.

World Cancer Day was observed by GMC Baramulla today. The event was observed at the Public Health Centre, Bagh-e-Islam in association with the Department of Radiation Oncology to raise awareness among the general public about cancer prevention, detection, and treatment.

The program was held in the presence of worthy Principal GMC Baramulla, Dr. (Prof) Ruby Reshi, under the supervision of Dr. Safoora Bilquees, Associate Professor, Community Medicine, and Dr. Lone M. Maqbool, Professor & Head of the Department of Radiation Oncology.

Opening remarks to the gathering were made by Dr. Safoora Bilquees, Associate Professor, Community Medicine. She laid down the need for more awareness of cancer and spoke heavily about the early detection of certain cancers. "Breast cancer in women is one of the most prevalent types of cancer and the second most deadly cancer. It is about 30% (or 1 in 3) of all new female cancers each year."

"Women should conduct physical exams regularly and immediately report any anomalies to their doctors. The earlier a cancer is detected, the better the chances of beating it."

Addressing the availability of treatment at GMC Baramulla, Dr. Lone M. Maqbool took the stage. He informed the people that the right infrastructure is available for cancer treatment now, "The hospital (GMC Baramulla) is now well-equipped to deal with cancer treatment as well as its detection."

"Previously people from North Kashmir would have to visit Srinagar now they do not have to worry they have all the facilities available here. There is no need to be afraid of cancer, it can be treated just like other diseases if it is caught and treated on time," he continued.

"The key is getting the treatment on time. Some people squander the valuable time required to treat the disease by relying on faith-based medical treatment. This needs to stop and people should incline more towards proven medicine."

In the concluding remarks, the worthy Principal further emphasized the need to keep a healthy lifestyle to keep cancer at bay. "We have the right technology, the right people, and the right environment needed to deal with all types of cancers. People in North Kashmir are in very good hands."

World Cancer Day is an international day marked on 4 February to raise awareness of cancer and to encourage its prevention, detection, and treatment.

Each year, hundreds of activities and events take place around the world, acting as a powerful reminder that we all have a role to play in reducing the global impact of cancer.



GMC Baramulla starts the National leprosy eradication programme

Continuing its efforts to raise community health awareness in rural areas, GMC Baramulla concluded the Village Health Nutrition Programme today. The day was marked by conducting a health camp under the National Leprosy Eradication Programme.

On-spot NCD Screening of old cases of Kalantra Bla.
 Nutritional and clinical antenatal counselling of pregnant ladies of the concerned villages.

The team included Ab Qayoom Shah, Irfan Hussain, Ishfaq Ali, AWWS, and Asha workers. The health team conducted activities to raise awareness and address the taboo surrounding the disease. The community stakeholders and households were educated about eliminating and tracking leprosy patients as well as its prevention. Information about government schemes that are available for such patients was also given to them.

A team of doctors' lead by Dr. Mudassir Muzamil & Dr. Owais performed this procedure which took 1 hour. The team was assisted by Dr. Javaid Ahmad and technical staff led by Mr. Jaffar Ahmad. The patient is doing well post-surgery.

Principal Govt. Medical College Baramulla and Medical Superintendent Associated Hospital congratulated the team of Doctors of the Department of Medicine for achieving the feet in cardiac surgery domain. They said that such operations are being performed at very few centres in Kashmir. They asserted that Medicine department will be provided with advanced surgical equipment for delivering top end facilities to the heart patients of North Kashmir.



World TB Day Celebrated at GMC Baramulla

GMC Baramulla in collaboration with the Centre for Health Research Innovation CHRI organized a program on the eve of World TB Day, celebrated every year on 24 March.

The program started with the flag off the IEC Van flagged by Incharge Principal GMC Baramulla Dr.(Prof.)Iffat Hassan in the presence of faculty members and students of the college. To generate mass awareness an IEC van equipped with banners and a public addressal system was also flagged off.

Later a day-long program was held in the academic block of the hospital in which the principal medical college, faculty members, and students

Dr. Waseem Iqbal(Assistant Professor) Department of Pediatrics moderated the program and welcomed the guests and participants.

Dr. (Prof.) Iffat Hassan in her inaugural address discussed in detail the global TB scenario and the efforts which are being taken to eliminate tuberculosis. She also talked about the political commitment the country has made toward the United Nations' sustainable goal of eliminating tuberculosis by 2025.

Professor Ab Majid HOD Community Medicine in his address discussed in detail the reason behind the celebration of World TB Day.

Dr. Shumail Bashir (Associate Professor) Department of Chest Medicine and Nodal Officer NTEP gave a detailed presentation on the Global TB burden and the concept of programmatic management of tuberculosis preventive treatment (PMTPT) to stop the transmission of tuberculosis at the latent level. She also spoke about the facilities available and services being provided at GMC to tuberculosis patients and the progress achieved in the elimination of tuberculosis.

Dr. Manzoor Mir, HOD Department of Bioresources gave a detailed presentation on Drug Resistance Tuberculosis (DR-TB) and discussed the research going on to develop an effective drug regimen against tuberculosis.

Dr. Manzoor in his lecture also spoke about his expertise and publications regarding the research on tuberculosis while giving details of the global TB burden and the efforts being taken in India to achieve the target of TB elimination by 2025.

Dr. Wasim Iqbal (Assistant Professor) Department of Pediatrics (Master Trainer PMTPT program) shared his experience of association with the Project JEET team and the efforts being undertaken by the JEET to promptly implement the program in the territory of J&K.

Lastly, Dr. Wasim presented the vote of thanks and the program ended with the felicitations of participants.



DEPARTMENT OF MEDICINE GMC BARAMULLA SUCCESSFULLY IMPLANTS THIRD DUAL CHAMBER PACEMAKER

The Department of Medicine, GMC Baramulla achieved a significant milestone by successfully implanting a dual chamber pacemaker in a 75-year-old patient who was admitted with multiple episodes of syncope.

The procedure was carried out after an ECG revealed LBBB with a high degree AV block.

The team of doctors, including Dr. Yasir Bashir(Assistant Professor) Department of Medicine, Dr. Mudasir Muzamil, DM Cardiology, and Dr. Javaid Wani, Medical Officer, successfully implanted the pacemaker without any complications. The team was supported by other technical staff.

The pacemaker implantation was performed under the PMJAY Scheme, which aims to provide accessible and affordable healthcare to all the patients. The program covers the costs of medical procedures for patients in need, and this successful implantation is a testament to the scheme's effectiveness in providing quality healthcare to all.

The team of doctors expressed their gratitude to the worthy Principal Dr. (Prof.) Ruby Reshi for their support. They also expressed hope for future advancements in the field of cardiology, which will enable them to provide even better care to their patients.



ADVANCED LAPAROSCOPIC SURGERY PERFORMED AT GMC BARAMULLA

Under the supervision of the Principal of GMC Baramulla, Dr. (Prof) Ruby Reshi, Dr. H. Vaqar, Head of the Department of General Surgery, Dr. Shakeeb Nabi, Assistant Professor of General Surgery, and Dr. Waseem Akbar (SR) performed a complex Spigelian hernia operation today. Dr. Fayaz Munshi, Professor in the Department of Anaesthesia, assisted as the anaesthetist.

Spigelian hernias are extremely rare, accounting for 0.12% to 2% of all abdominal wall hernias. The team performed a transabdominal preperitoneal mesh plasty, an advanced laparoscopic procedure.

The costs of the surgery were covered by PMJAY, which aims to provide accessible and affordable healthcare to those in need.

This successful surgery highlights the importance of having skilled healthcare professionals and accessible healthcare schemes in place to handle rare medical conditions and provide affordable healthcare to all.

Major neck **GMC** tumour removed in Baramulla.

A major neck surgery was conducted by the department of ENT, GMC Baramulla, headed by Prof. Nazir Ahmad Khan. The surgery involved the removal of a cystic schwannoma, in a 29-year-old patient. The surgery was performed by Dr Zafarullah Beigh, Assistant Professor, ENT, who successfully dissected the tumour completely without any complications. Principal GMC Baramulla, and Dr.(Prof.)Ruby Reshi, appreciated the team for their exceptional work. This successful surgery is a testament to the excellence of the ENT department at GMC Baramulla and the high level of medical expertise available in the northern region of Kashmir.

Narrow Band UVB whole body chamber was inaugurated at GMC Baramulla by the worthy Principal Dr. (Prof) Ruby Reshi on 31 March 2023. It is the first of its kind machine in North Kashmir to facilitate the patients who had to be referred to a higher centre like SMHS/SKIMS for this procedure.

Before these facilities, patients had to travel to Srinagar three times a week for medical assistance. But with these new facilities, they will be able to receive the necessary care and treatment closer to home."

Narrowband UVB treatment is to be given thrice a week which affects the patient's day-to-day activities due to long-term compliance to the treatment for months and would be problematic in view of time efforts and financial implications.



Due to the efforts of worthy Principal Dr. (Prof) Ruby Reshi in collaboration with the Department of Dermatology GMC Baramulla availability of this service has made it easy for people of north Kashmir to avail the treatment facility.

A health awareness camp on the topics of Polycystic Ovary Syndrome (PCOS) and anaemia was conducted at Girls Higher Secondary School(GHSS), Old Town Baramulla

The primary objective of the program was to provide awareness and health education sessions to adolescent girls regarding Polycystic Ovary Syndrome (PCOS). During the camp, on-the-spot haemoglobin tests were carried out on 83 female students, revealing that 60% of the students were anaemic. To address this, iron and folic acid tablets were distributed among the affected students.








Revolutionizing healthcare with technology: GMC Baramulla starts QR code-based OPD registration service under Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission.

In a significant development in the healthcare sector, Government Medical College (GMC) in Baramulla starts QR codebased Outpatient Department (OPD) registration services as part of the Ayushman Bharat Digital Mission. This innovative service will enable patients to register for medical appointments through a unique QR code generated by the hospital. The QR code-based OPD registration service allows patients to scan the hospital's unique QR code with their mobile phones and submit their data to the hospital. The hospital then issues a queue number or token after the profile is shared. This token is delivered as a notice to the patient's chosen app and is also displayed on screens located at the OPD registration counters for the convenience of patients. This service aims to streamline the OPD registration process and reduce waiting times for patients. With the use of technology, patients will no longer have to wait in long queues to register for medical appointments. They can simply scan the QR code and provide their details from the comfort of their homes or while on the go.

This information is invaluable for the diagnosis and treatment of various medical conditions and can help provide personalized treatment plans for patients. With the integration of this innovation into their diagnostic procedures, the medical staff at GMC Baramulla can better understand their patient's health needs and provide improved healthcare services.

Dr Mosin Saleem Khan, Assistant Professor, Bio-Chemistry and In-charge of the Central Laboratory was also present at the inauguration ceremony. In addition, the in-charges of the Medical Records Department (MRD) and other staff members were also in attendance.

Surgery For disseminated Hydatid disease of the abdomen performed at <u>Govt. Medical College Baramulla</u>

A 24-year-old female patient underwent a fourth redo surgery at GMC Baramulla on May 16, 2023, for disseminated Hydatid Disease of the abdomen.

Under the supervision of the principal, GMC Baramulla Dr (Prof) Ruby Reshi, The day-long surgery was performed by Dr H. Vaqar and Dr Mahmood Rashid, Associate Professors, Surgery department, along with Dr Mohsin, Consultant CVTS, and Dr Farah, Consultant Gynae. The surgical team was assisted by Dr Wasim Salman, Associate Professor, Anesthesia, and Dr Gulzar. Consultant Anesthesia.

All the cysts were removed entirely without any spill and the use of harmonic dissector was done due to difficult access of cysts and adhesions with great vessels.

Following the surgery, the patient was extubated and is currently recovering well in the postoperative ward. The successful execution of the surgery procedures at GMC Baramulla has been made possible through the encouragement, logistic support, and patronage provided by the principal.

GMC Baramulla successfully performs first Ventriculoperitoneal Shunt Operation of a patient with NPH

As part of its commitment to improving healthcare services in the region, the Department of General Surgery, GMC Baramulla successfully conducted its first Ventriculoperitoneal (VP) Shunt Operation of a patient suffering from Normal Pressure Hydrocephalus (NPH)

The VP shunt surgery was a resounding success, and the patient showed significant improvement in his condition post-surgery. He regained his memory and balance and even started ambulating, which was a remarkable achievement for the surgical team. The patient, who was previously diaper-dependent, regained his continence and started going to the washroom on his own. The patient had been bedridden for two months, suffering from memory loss (Dementia), imbalance, and incontinence of urine.

For the first time in GMC Baramulla, they used the Bispectral index (BIS) and Neuromuscular monitor, which are the most advanced techniques in anaesthesia administration and monitoring.

Laparoscopic Assisted Total Gastrectomy conducted successfully at GMC Baramulla

Continuing its pursuits to complete complicated surgeries, the Department of General Surgery Government Medical College Baramulla operated on a 40-year-old male patient with Endoscopic and CT documented Gastric (stomach) cancer.

A Laparoscopic Assisted Total Gastrectomy (stomach removal) and esophagojejunostomy with jejunojejunostomy (stapled anastomosis) with mesenteric lymph node sampling was done by Dr H Vaqar HOD General Surgery. Dr. Mir Mushtaq was Consultant Surgery with anesthesia support and control provided by Dr Fayaz, Dr Tahira, Rubiya with the support of theater assistants Juneed and Mudasir.

The surgical team successfully addressed complex maxillofacial injuries and restored facial aesthetics and function. The patient presented with a severe case of zygomaticomaxillary complex fracture, which not only caused cosmetic deformity but also resulted in functional deficits such as altered vision, restricted mouth opening, and paresthesia. The restitution of the zygomaticomaxillary complex posed a substantial challenge due to its intricate articulation within the craniofacial skeleton, requiring meticulous intra-operative assessment to ensure accurate reduction at all points. The Department of Maxillofacial Surgery, the team performed an open reduction and internal fixation to restore both the patient's facial aesthetics and functional deficits. The procedure involved open reduction and internal fixation, carried out under general anaesthesia provided by Dr Fehmeeda, with the assistance and collaboration of the Department of Orthopaedics on March 14, 2023.

Expressing gratitude for the support received, the surgical team acknowledges the contributions of Dr Budoo, Dr Zameer, Dr Basharat Saleem Head of the department of anaesthesia and their dedicated team for their assistance throughout the procedure. In a separate instance, GMC Baramulla also performed surgery on April 15, 2023, to address a mandibular fracture, further showcasing the hospital's commitment to providing specialized care for patients. A 9-year-old female child with an atypical diagnosis of symptomatic cholelithiasis was recently admitted for surgery, displaying an ultrasound abdomen with a gall bladder densely packed with multiple, small, faceted gallstones, along with features of chronic cholecystitis. After clearing the child for the procedure paediatric laparoscopic cholecystectomy was performed in the hospital on July 18, 2023.

The surgery was conducted by a team of skilled doctors led by Dr Mahmood Rashid and Dr Mohsin, under the supervision of Dr H. Vaqar Hod General Surgery. Anesthesia services were provided by Dr Fehmeeda associate professor of Anesthesia and Dr Gulzar, consultant Anesthesiologist.



Congratulating the Department of Microbiology on this initiative, The Principal also stressed the significance of proper segregation and disposal of biomedical waste.

GMC Baramulla Performs Complex Surgery on Young Male with Rare Operative Finding

A 35-year-old male hailing from a remote area in District Kupwara was referred to the Department of General Surgery at GMC Baramulla in critical condition. On 11th July 2023, the patient underwent exploratory laparotomy for a leaking small gut anastomosis with faecal peritonitis.

The surgery was carried out by a team of surgeons, including Dr Mahmood Rashid, Associate Professor of General Surgery, Dr Mohsin, CVTS Surgeon, and Dr Fuad, Urologist, under the supervision of Dr H. Vaqar Ahmad, HOD of General Surgery. The anaesthesia services were provided by Dr Fehmeeda, Associate Professor of Anaesthesia, and Dr Gulzar, Consultant Anaesthesia.

During the operation, the surgical team encountered a rare and intriguing finding - a long wandering roundworm (Ascaris lumbricoides) that had penetrated through the anastomotic suture line, causing leakage of faecal matter into the general peritoneal cavity.

The surgeons completed the four-hour-long surgery, meticulously performing thorough peritoneal lavages and mopping the peritoneal cavity. In light of the friable small gut and dense organized adhesions, a diversion loop ileostomy was performed to ensure the patient's optimal recovery.

After the surgery, the patient was moved to the high-dependency section of the Post Operative Unit, where he is currently showing signs of improvement and is under careful observation.

The success of such intricate procedures at GMC Baramulla is credited to the unwavering support and encouragement of the esteemed Principal, Dr (Prof) Ruby Reshi.


Professor Dr Kapil Sikka and Dr Arvind Kairo from AIIMS New Delhi acted as mentor surgeons for these procedures.

A 60-year-old patient from Baramulla sustained an injury to the back following a fall from height. The patient was diagnosed with a highly unstable D10 D11 and D12 spine fracture.

The patient was operated on successfully by Dr Zameer Ali (consultant orthopaedic) and assisted by Dr Ovais (Senior resident). Anesthesia was given by Dr. Fahmeeda and the team.

the spine was successfully fixed with Pedicle screws from D9 level to L1.

This surgery was done under Ayushman Bharat scheme and all the treatment was done free of cost in the hospital.

A critical surgery was performed on a patient with abdominal distension and documented bilateral ovarian masses (Mucosa cystadenocarcinoma). The procedure involved laparotomy and successful excision of sizable masses, approximately 12*12 inches and 6*6 inches, along with the evacuation of 5 litres of fluid. The team of doctors comprising Dr H Viqar and Dr Mir Mushtaq, & Dr Yasir, assisted by Mr Mudasir, and Mr Junaid as OT technicians, completed the surgery, highlighting the routine nature of such procedures at GMC Baramulla.

The Centre for Health Research and Innovation (CHRI), in collaboration with the Government Medical College Baramulla and the National Tuberculosis Elimination Program (NTEP) Baramulla, organized a one-day CME on PMTPT (Programmatic Management of Tuberculosis: Preventive Treatment) under Project JEET (Joint Effort for Elimination of Tuberculosis).

He stressed the need for the latest techniques in the pathological diagnosis of breast cancer as these techniques not only help in the diagnosis of the disease but also guide us about the treatment of the disease as well.














CULTURAL WEEK

Also speaking at the event MS, Associated Hospital Dr Parvaiz Masoodi said," The need for a lifestyle change to combat diabetes as an epidemic could not be higher. While the medical care is on par with treatment, a change in one's personal life is the need of the hour." He further added that GMC Baramulla in its efforts currently ranks number one in the union territory of J&K and nationally number four in diabetic-related care.

GMC BARAMULLA ACHIEVES MILESTONE WITH SUCCESSFUL LAPAROSCOPIC RESECTION OF A LARGE GASTROINTESTINAL STROMAL TUMOR ARISING FROM THE STOMACH

In a groundbreaking surgical intervention, the team at GMC Baramulla executed a laparoscopic resection of a sizable 9x8 cm Gastric Gastrointestinal Stromal Tumor (GIST) in a 70-year-old female from Bandipora.

The patient, who had been experiencing early satiety, dyspeptic symptoms, and anemia, sought relief through Surgical OPD consultations. Upon evaluation ,an UGI endoscopy performed by Dr Hilal Ahmad Dar revealed a large submucosal mass consistent with a GIST which was further correlated on imaging.

Led by Dr. H. Vaqar, Head of the Surgery Department, and supported by Dr. Abid Hussain Wani, Dr. Shakeeb Nabi, and Dr. Faud, the laparoscopic procedure was completed successfully sans any eventuality.

The anesthesia team, headed by Prof Basharat Saleem, included Dr. Tehleel and their dedicated support staff.

The patient is now recovering well in the post-operative period, marking a significant step forward in the treatment of complex gastrointestinal conditions.



All the expenses of surgery were covered under the PMJAY Sehat scheme.

This successful intervention not only highlights the medical prowess of the team but also emphasizes the institutional commitment to advanced and minimally invasive surgical techniques.

The operating team thanked the Principal GMC Baramulla Professor Ruby Reshi for all the logistic support received to conduct such procedures.

CPR AWARENESS PROGRAMME CONDUCTED AT ASSOCIATED HOSPITAL GMC BARAMULLA

The Associated Hospital Government Medical College organized a one-day Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Awareness Programme, in collaboration with the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and the National Board of Examinations in Medical Sciences (NBEMS). The event, commencing at 9:30 AM, drew a turnout of approximately 150 participants.

Under the patronage of GMC Baramulla's Principal, Dr (Prof) Ruby Reshi, the program aimed to underscore the crucial importance of basic life-saving skills for individuals within and beyond the medical sector. The Principal stressed the significance of CPR training for everyone, emphasizing its potential to save lives in emergencies. Dr Parvaiz Masoodi, Medical Superintendent of Associated Hospital GMC Baramulla, ensured the necessary infrastructure and manpower for the program.

The event started with an online address by NBEMS President Dr Abhijat Sheth, highlighting the importance of learning CPR to prevent cardiac deaths. National-level experts, Dr Sanjeev Mittal and Dr Debasis Dhar from NBEMS demonstrated CPR techniques online, followed by hands-on training led by GMC experts, including Dr Afak Sherwani and Dr Yasir Bashir. Comprehensive presentations on Basic Life Support and Advanced Cardiac Life Support enhanced participants' knowledge.

A digital certificate of participation from NBEMS was provided to participants at the program's conclusion.

Dr Waseem Iqbal, Assistant Professor Pediatrics and Nodal Officer DNB Courses GMC Baramulla coordinated the program, ensuring its smooth execution. Dr Ruby Reshi expressed gratitude to NBEMS for their collaboration, affirming GMC Baramulla's commitment to hosting such initiatives.

The hospital plans to regularly organise Basic Life Support and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation Awareness programmes for all employees, especially newcomers to equip them with this lif-saving skill.









Assisted Thoracoscopy(VATS) Curative Surgery Performed at the Associated Hospital GMC Baramulla

One more milestone towards enduring advanced Healthcare Services through the Department of General Video Surgery, a video-assisted Thoracoscopy(VATS) was performed with a pleural cavity lavage with pleural biopsy done under single lung ventilation by Dr. H Vaqar (HOD Surgery), Dr Mir Mushtaq(CVTS Surgeon), Dr. Zuneera.

A 35-year-old female presented with fever, chills, cough, and CT-documented pre and paratracheal lymphadenopathy with a collection of purulent fluid in the right pleural cavity was referred by a pulmonologist for thoracoscopy with pleural biopsy.

The challenging single lung ventilation with double lumen endotracheal tube during the procedure was possible under the anaesthetic leadership of Prof Basharat Saleem, Dr. Waseem Salman, and Dr. Yasir with the technical support of Mr. Nazir Ahmad, Mr. Ab Hameed, Mr. Mudasir, and Mr. Juneed.

Video Assisted Thoracoscopy (VATS) like any other minimal access surgery has the obvious advantage of less surgical insult, enabling quicker recovery with its attendant reduced hospital costs and earlier return to work.

Minimally invasive surgery has achieved an indispensable role in certain areas of elective general surgery in the last 30 years, even to the extent of being considered the gold standard, e.g., in cholecystectomy.

On December 20, 2023, GMC Baramulla, in collaboration with the National Hydroelectric Power Corporation (NHPC) sector Uri, organized a voluntary blood donation camp at NHPC Salamabad Uri. The camp, inaugurated by the Principal GMC Baramulla Dr(prof) Ruby Reshi, successfully collected 20 units of blood.









GMC Baramulla holds a one-day CME on Programmatic Management of Tuberculosis Preventive Treatment- PMTPT.

Department of Chest Medicine GMC Baramulla in collaboration with CHRI, organized a one-day Continuing Medical Education (CME) programme. The event focussed on programmatic management of tuberculosis preventive treatment under project JEET - Joint Effort for Elimination of Tuberculosis a Global Fund-supported Project.

The CME was attended by Professor Dr Naveed Nazir Chairman State Task Force Committee NTEP J&K, Professor Dr Ruby Reshi, Principal GMC Baramulla, Dr Parvaiz Masoodi, Medical Superintendent AHGMC Baramulla, Heads of Departments of the Medical College, senior faculty members, PG students and NTEP officials.

Professor Dr Ruby Reshi Principal GMC Baramulla gave the inaugural address. The worthy principal complimented the organisers for organising the CME on such an important public health program to update and enrich the faculty members with the latest advances in diagnostic and treatment services under the National Tuberculosis Elimination Program.

The session saw Dr Shumail Bashir Associate Professor and Nodal Officer NTEP GMC Baramulla give a detailed presentation on PMTPT and discuss the treatment algorithm to screen the high-risk population and the importance of contact tracing of active tuberculosis patients.

In his keynote address, Dr. Naveed Nazir Shah, Chairman of the State Task Committee for NTEP, delved into the intricacies of managing tuberculosis and underscored the critical significance of Tuberculosis Preventive Treatment (TPT) among high-risk populations. Dr Naveed emphasized the need for healthcare practitioners to embrace the PMTPT guidelines, urging them to proactively screen individuals at high risk of latent tuberculosis.

Dr Wasim Iqbal Assistant Professor Department of Pediatrics gave a brief presentation on the importance of the PMTPT program and discussed in detail the challenges in diagnosing TB among children.

Professor Dr Abdul Majid Head Dept of Community Medicine and Chairman TB Core Committee GMC Baramulla discussed in detail the efforts being undertaken to sensitize the community on tuberculosis prevention measures and the outreach health programs conducted in several places.

Mr Kifayat Wani District supervisor Project JEET gave a detailed presentation regarding the efforts made to implement the PMTPT program in district baramulla.

The session concluded with an interactive Q&A segment, followed by a special recognition of the participants for their engagement and contribution.
